# The State of Polio Eradication - India

As per WHO, global polio eradication depends on the engagement of the leaders of the only four countries which have never stopped polio: Nigeria, India, Pakistan and Afghanistan.

In addition to the endemic countries, 12 countries have reported polio cases in 2006 due to *importations* (Somalia, Yemen, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Ethiopia, Kenya, Angola, Cameroon, Namibia, Niger, Nepal and DR Congo).

17 new cases were reported in India in the first week of January, all type-1 wild poliovirus; 600+ cases are reported over the last year:

- > The Board of Rotary International, in its meeting in November 2006, discussed sites for the 2013 international convention, and tentatively selected Lisbon, Portugal, subject to various logistical concerns.
- > The Board also suggested that clubs establish a new club trainer position to help develop the personal leadership skills of club members. Club presidents, governors, assistant governors, and the district training committee should support such club-level training efforts. Guidelines for the club-level leadership development program will be published in the near future. RCHE, as a model club, is ahead of the curve on this one!
- > What do the National Council for International Health, the International Public Relations Association, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the American Academy of Pediatrics, and the World Food Programme all have in common? Each of these organizations has recognized Rotary International and its Foundation for their work in polio eradication.
